Know the Enemy: Compulsive Gambling.

If you picked up a gambling problem while serving, you're not alone. It's estimated there may be at least 36,000-48,000 active duty service members with gambling problems. Gambling in the military is fairly common because of the high-risk environment, downtime, boredom, stress, isolation and 24/7 access to online gaming. Compulsive gambling is a serious disorder, which can lead to suicide, depression, alcohol abuse and crime. Like other compulsive and addictive behaviors, problem gambling is most effectively treated through counseling from a professional treatment provider. Now's the time to get help.









THE WARNING SIGNS.

- Increased frequency of gambling
- Maxing out credit lines to gamble
- Mood swings
- Isolation, withdrawal, secretive behavior
- Dishonesty or lying
- Gambling to win back debt

THE CONSEQUENCES OF PROBLEM GAMBLING.

- Financial: stealing, fraud, bankruptcy
- Psychological: depression, suicide
- Social: isolation, withdrawal
- Vocational: decline in work performance

IMPLICATIONS FOR MILITARY PERSONNEL.

- Impact on family relationships.
- Marital, social, occupational, financial and spiritual problems.
- Potential impact on individual readiness.

WHAT CAN HAPPEN?

- Loss of rank
- Bad conduct discharges
- Security risk
- Divorce
- Forced retirements
- Letters of indebtedness
